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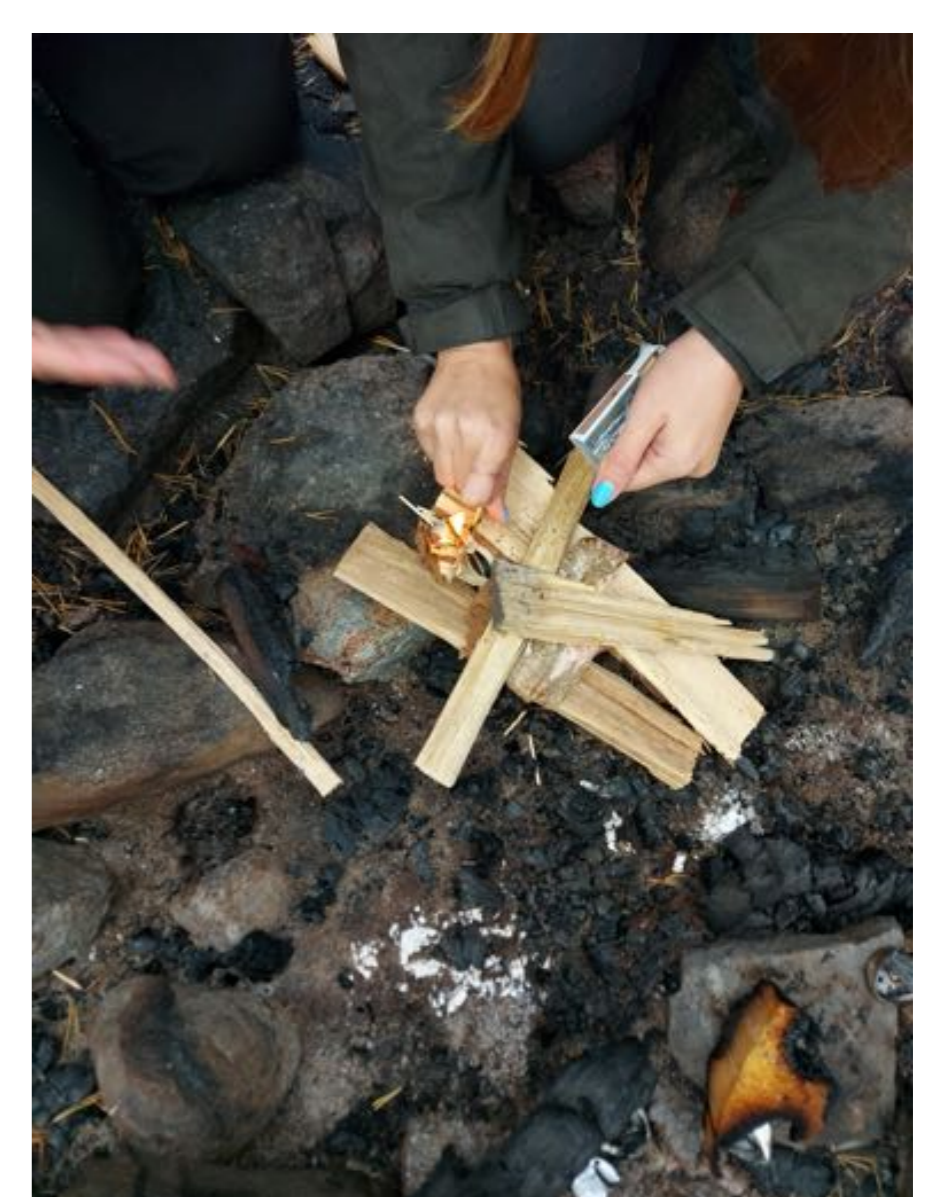
The Environmental Education Path

Learning environments, methods and objectives for grades 1 to 6

The Environmental Education Path contains separate learning environments, methods, and objectives for each grade. In grades 1-2 the goal is to develop a connection with nature. Learning takes place in the nearby nature. Methods involve play, sensory observations and spending time in nature.

In grades 3-4, the objective is to foster active environmental agency. This goal is achieved through conducting observations and experiments. Spending time and playing in nature are used as methods as well.

For grades 5-6, the focus is on taking action and promoting eco-social understanding. Taking action for the environment serves as a way to achieve these goals. Nature schools and digital learning environments complement the learning environments already in use.
